What is the Alpine Loop?

The Alpine Loop is a 60+ mile network of old 4x4 mining roads connecting the southern Colorado mountain towns of Lake City, Silverton, and Ouray.

The Loop connects two high-elevation mountain passes, Cinnamon Pass and Engineer Pass. Only 4 miles of the entire 60+ mile route are paved. The Loop tops out at an elevation of 12,800 ft on Engineer Pass, with much of the road above the tree line.

Access to the Alpine Loop, lodging, restaurants, and Off-Highway Vehicle (OHV) rental are available in Lake City, Colorado. ATVs and OHVs are allowed on the streets of Lake City, Colorado, they are not allowed on any city street in Silverton, Ouray, or Telluride

Distance from Lakeville, MN to Lake City, Colorado: 1,144 miles. Approx 17 hrs
